'Les'

Les Neumann (Dad and Poppy) was a gentle, caring and determined man who loved his family, animals, sport, music, his garden and food.

Leslie Edward Neumann was born on the 20th April 1933 in Sydney. He was the fourth child of Frank Campbell Neumann and Myrtle Ann Louise Neumann (nee Baker).

Les spent his early years in Benalla (Vic) which included his Primary School years. He fondly remembered having fun down at the river with his younger brothers and friends at weekends and holidays.

The Family moved to Wagga in 1945. Les went to Wagga High School. He left school to work at a Service Station and started a Mechanics Course at TAFE.

This didn't last as he became ill with Rheumatic Fever which almost took his life.

This was the end of his dream to become a mechanic.

Determined to work after recovery Les worked for Croft Stores fulfilling orders and delivering them on his pushbike. He then worked at Hardy's Joinery for a number of years. Working on the timber saws he managed to sever 2 fingers on his right hand, thus the nickname at bowls of 'fingers'.

Because of the Rheumatic Fever, Les could not do his
National Service at 18 but eventually could at 21. He
thoroughly enjoyed his time there but when asked to continue
he declined and returned to Wagga. He married and from
that marriage had 2 daughters Carol and Kay
whom he adored.

In 1970 Les was working at the Wagga Council as a Gas Metre Reader when he had a life altering accident when the scooter he was riding was hit by a car. His long recovery showed his determination and resilience to get on in life.

Les met Doreen Kroker through love of sport and mutual friends. They married on the 20th of July 1974. He embraced becoming part of her extended family with many nieces and nephews. With Doreen Les enjoyed attending church activities and the wider community that it offered.

Les worked for Wagga Motors for 6 years then Moore
Paragon for 15 years medically retiring at 60 due to ongoing
problems from his previous injuries. Doreen retired at the
same time so they could enjoy playing bowls, going on
holidays and visiting friends and family.

Les loved all sport. In his early years Les played Australian Rules Football, Cricket and Tennis at a high level doing well at them all. He also refereed Australian Rules Football around the region. Later Les took up Lawn Bowls where once again he won many trophies including state level. He keenly watched most sport but particularly liked watching his beloved Swans play and hopefully win.

Les had progressive hearing loss from an early age and had a Cochlear implant in 2011 for which he was a star recipient and it greatly enhanced his ability to communicate and take part in everyday life.

Providing for Doreen and his daughters was very important for Les and he was proud of his family home. Les was a loving and caring husband, Dad and Poppy. His health declined over the last 8 years but he always knew Doreen and his 'girls'. He would want you all to take care of each other.
